Introduction

- 23 April 2020 ONS Statistics for the Construction Industry relating to 23 March – 5 April:
 - \rightarrow 34.4% decreased working hours
 - \rightarrow 63.6% laying off staff in the short term

→Of companies still trading, construction is the second highest industry (ahead of hotels and restaurants) with the % of staff on furlough at 32%

→Businesses within the construction industry had one of the highest proportions of reducing staffing levels in the short term, at 64%

Introduction

- 23 April 2020 ONS Statistics for the Construction Industry relating to 23 March – 9 April:
 - \rightarrow 29.1% temporarily closed / paused trading

 \rightarrow 70.9% continued trading

• 27 April 2020 – Construction Manager and the CIOB:

→56% said their organisations were keeping all or some sites open
→ Of these, 57% said their organisations believed health guidelines and rules around social distancing could still be followed

- What rules / regulations / guidance is there on keeping sites open?
 - \rightarrow Different positions in devolved nations

 - \rightarrow CLC Site Operating (now version 3)

What now?

- Sites are beginning to re-open (from now onwards?)
